The duodenum becomes partly retroperitoneal, and is fixed by the gastro-hepatic ligament at the junction of the first and second portions, and by the muscle of Trietz below. The ascending and descending colons lose their mesenteries, becoming partly retroperitoneal, and the hepatic and splenic flexures become fixed points. The transverse colon alone is allowed to swing free, but here nature has attempted to add additional support to this organ by dropping the omentum from the greater border of the stomach down over the colon and allowing it to fuse with the peritoneum covering it. Another factor of exceedingly great moment is the shape of the abdominal cavity itself, as determined by spine and the bony pelvis.
